The Festival operates an equal opportunities policy, in line with the recommendations of the British & International Federation of Festivals for Music, Dance and Speech

Festival Personnel

All 'Perform in Perth' personnel wear clear colour-coded photo identification and have clearly defined roles within the organisation.

Stewards (yellow lanyards) should be approached for help and guidance. If Stewards do not know the answer to a question, they will consult the Stewards' Convenor.

The Chairman, Secretary, Child Protection Officer, President, Treasurer and Committee (all blue lanyards) should be treated as Stewards.

Accompanists (green lanyards) should be approached via a Steward. Accompanists may approach competitors before their performance.

Adjudicators (red lanyards) should not be approached while a session is in progress. Anyone wishing to speak to an adjudicator should request this through the Secretary.

The British & International Federation of Festivals for Music, Speech & Dance Adjudicators will wear Federation ID, which carries the Federation logo.

Young Ambassadors are a new role available to anyone aged 12 to 25 and who has participated in Perform in Perth at least once. In addition to undertaking a Steward role at the festival, Young Ambassadors may also participate in our Young Ambassador Scheme by mentoring another performer in their preparation for taking part in Perform in Perth, by giving talks about participation or by fundraising for the festival. Details are on the website. Young Ambassadors can put their Perform in Perth hours towards a Saltire Award.

Anyone wishing to speak to the Secretary can request this through a Steward.

'Perform in Perth' has a Safeguarding Policy which is displayed clearly at each venue as well as being available on the website, in the Syllabus and the Programme and with the Timetable which is sent to every applicant.

Every applicant has stated that they give or have obtained permission for children and vulnerable adults to participate in our festival.

General Comments

- 1. Only *bona fide* teachers accompanying groups are excused an entry fee.
- 2. Perform in Perth will not be held responsible for items which are either lost or stolen.
- 3. Perform in Perth is not responsible for supplying or moving equipment.
- 4. Any <u>original</u> 'own choice' music should be collected along with mark sheets and certificates.
- 5. Certificates not available at any other venue will be available at St Leonard's-in-the-Fields Church, later in the festival.
- 6. It is not in the spirit of the festival movement for competitors or their supporters to pass comment, whether it is directed at a competitor or at an adjudicator.
- 7. Silence during competition makes it fair for all performers.
- 8. Photography, including digital photography, and recording, either audio or video, are not permitted, other than by press photographers or festival-appointed photographers.
- 9. Mobile telephones must be switched off prior to entering the competition area.

Festival sessions are generally 3 hours long; therefore, for example, a session which commences at 2 p.m. cannot be expected to finish before 5 p.m.

Parents/teachers/leaders are reminded that they are responsible for the conduct and safety of school age competitors in their charge.

Seonag Anderson

Since 2014, Seonag has worked at An Comunn Gàidhealach, one of the few Gaelic-speaking workplaces in Scotland. A native Gaelic speaker, he has adjudicated at Local Mods and music festivals for many years and very much enjoys all the performances.

After graduating from Cambridge, Libby sang and recorded with The Sixteen and other leading Baroque ensembles for over 30 years. She now focuses on conducting, presenting workshops, and examining. She also teaches the choristers at St Mary's Music School Edinburgh and runs adult courses in sight reading and musical theatre. ABRSM examining, ten years' experience as department Head of Music, and acting and singing on stage in London's West End, have combined to give Libby an unrivalled breadth of expertise. Libby is an adjudicator member of the British and International Federation of Festivals.

Alasdair Kelly

Alasdair is a freelance timpanist and percussionist based in Scotland and performs all round the UK and Europe. He is in demand as guest principal with orchestras including the BBC Scottish Symphony Orchestra, Royal Scottish National Orchestra, Scottish Chamber Orchestra, Royal Philharmonic Orchestra and Royal Northern Sinfonia, and was Principal Timpanist of the Teatro Comunale di Bologna, Italy from 2008-2012. In addition, he is a frequent deputy musician for the West End production of Les Miserables and other touring shows. Alasdair has a particular interest in orchestra mallet playing, but a run of concerts can encompass a huge breadth of styles, from Mozart piano concertos to James Bond gala concerts, via Glasgow's contemporary 'Tectonics' festival and large scale symphonic works. Alasdair teaches percussion at the Royal Conservatoire of Scotland and is a frequent tutor for youth bands and orchestras

Judey Struth

An Associate of Trinity College, London, Judey has been involved with Festivals as a performer, teacher and parent for over 50 years. Her passion is poetry - Scots in particular - and as an adjudicator she wants to encourage teachers, parents and children to support their local Festivals and discover the fun and tremendous life-skills to be gained through performance. John Wallace CBE

John was born in Fife, Scotland, into a brass band family. He was a member of NYBBS, the National Youth Orchestra of Great Britain and studied music at Kings College, Cambridge. As a performer, he played trumpet in the LSO, Philharmonia, and London Sinfonietta, and founded The Wallace Collection brass ensemble. In 2002 he changed career to become the Principal of the Royal Conservatoire of Scotland. He resumed his musical career in 2014. He also convenes Scotland's Music Education Partnership Group, is a board member of the Scottish Funding Council, chairs The Glasgow Barons' orchestra, and is Honorary Professor of Brass at the University of St Andrews. Also a composer, he has recently written a Symphony for Brass Band, and a one act opera, *Opsnizing Dad*. He was

awarded the 2021 Queen's Medal for Music.

Kenneth Blackwood

Ken started playing French Horn at school and, following several years attending Junior RSAMD, went on to study with Maurice Temple at the RSAMD (now the Royal Conservatoire of Scotland, going on to play in the Scottish Opera Orchestra and the Royal Scottish National Orchestra, meanwhile teaching at the Junior Conservatoire, taking the role of Head of Brass at Douglas Academy and coaching a number of Youth Orchestras. In 2003, Ken left the RSNO to take up the position of Senior Teacher in East Renfrewshire Music Service and continues to play regularly, adjudicate at festivals and conduct Croy Brass Band.

Karen Anderson

Karen studied clarinet with Lewis Morrison and John Cushing at the RSAMD, winning the Glasgow Society of Musicians Prize for Woodwind in 1990. She went on to freelance extensively in Scotland and the North of England. Karen is currently Principal Music Instructor for the North Highlands, clarinet tutor for the Highland Regional Youth Orchestra and saxophone tutor for the Highland Youth Big Band, as well as being an adjudicator for the British and International Federation of Festivals and an ABRSM examiner.

Jonathan Rea BEM

Jonathan studied music at Cambridge, where he sang in the University Chamber Choir and studied piano with Peter Pettinger. He held choral and instrumental awards and won the Rima Alamuddin prize for piano performance. After 10 happy years as Director of Music in Bangor Grammar School, he began a broader career in conducting, producing, writing, composing, arranging and piano accompanying. Jonathan is Creative Director and Chief Executive of New Irish Arts, whose choir, orchestra and youth choir perform at over 20 events per year. He enjoys being a Federation adjudicator because he finds it immensely satisfying to play a part in helping people pursue their musical potential.

Maureen Rutherford

Mo was very much involved in Scottish traditional music from a very young age, playing both fiddle and piano in her dad's bands. She went on to study music at Aberdeen University, graduating with honours in piano performance. Mo was Music Director for the Royal Scottish Country Dance Society for 10 years and has been our official SCD accompanist for many years, as well as adjudicating some of our traditional music classes.

Andrew Johnston

Andrew has performed as a chamber musician and soloist in Britain and abroad, including concerto performances of Tchaikovsky Piano Concerto no. 1, Grieg Piano Concerto and Beethoven Piano Concerto in Kiev, Ukraine. Andrew has performed with ensembles such as the Edinburgh Quartet, Rose Street Quartet, Goldsmith's Symphony Orchestra, the Edinburgh Charity Orchestra and the Calton Consort. He also works regularly with soprano Colleen Nicoll, tenor David Douglas and violist Jessica Beeston. Following a period living and working in London, he has now settled in Highland Perthshire where he has a thriving teaching practice alongside his performing activities. In 2018 he was appointed accompanist and joint Musical Director for Pitlochry Choral Society, and in 2019 he started teaching at the Royal Conservatoire of Scotland Junior Department. He also teaches at Kilgraston School, Glenalmond College and Strathallan School.

Dougie Flower

Dougie is a freelance musician, teacher and Musical Director, based in Perth. He works with various groups including Scottish Police and Community Choir, National Youth Choir of Scotland, Horsecross Arts and the Kinross Kacophony Orchestra. He also teaches piano at Morrison's Academy and Strathallan School.

Having been Principal Teacher of Music at Breadalbane Academy, Aberfeldy, for many years, Gordon now teaches part-time at Kilgraston school. The Federation, and our member Festivals, are committed to ensuring safe environments for children and young people and believe that it is always unacceptable for a child or young person to experience abuse of any kind. We recognise our responsibility to safeguard the welfare of all children and young people, by a commitment to recommend best practice which protects them.

This policy applies to our Board of Trustees, paid staff, Adjudicator members, volunteers, students or anyone working on behalf of the Federation and our member Festivals.

The purpose of the policy:

- to provide protection for the children and young people who participate in our festivals, including the children of festival members
- to provide staff and volunteers with guidance on procedures they should adopt in the event that they suspect a child or young person may be experiencing, or be at risk of, harm

We will seek to safeguard children and young people by:

- valuing them, listening to and respecting them
- adopting child protection guidelines through procedures and safe working practice for staff and volunteers
- recruiting staff and volunteers safely, ensuring all necessary checks are made
- sharing information about child protection and safe working practice with children, parents, staff and volunteers
- sharing information about concerns with agencies who need to know, and involving parents and children appropriately
- providing effective management for staff and volunteers through supervision, support and training.

The Federation will review this policy each year in November in line with Safe Network guidance or sooner in light of any changes in legislation or guidance. All changes will be communicated to our member Festivals in time for the start of the new Festival year.

The purpose of the policy:

- to provide protection for vulnerable adults at risk who participate in our festivals,
- to provide staff and volunteers with guidance on procedures they should adopt in the event that they suspect a vulnerable adult may be experiencing, or be at risk of, harm
- to actively promote the empowerment and well-being of vulnerable adults who participate in our festivals

We will seek to safeguard vulnerable adults at risk by:

- valuing them, listening to and respecting them
- adopting safe working practices for staff and volunteers
- recruiting staff and volunteers safely, ensuring all necessary checks are made
- sharing information appropriately about adults who are at risk, with their consent
- if consent is refused and there are considered to be serious concerns of abuse for the individual concerned or others, then consent may be overridden in line with guidance, and only shared appropriately with those who need to know
- providing effective management for staff and volunteers through supervision, support and training

The Federation will review this policy each year in November or sooner in light of any changes in legislation or guidance. All changes will be communicated to our member Festivals in time for the start of the new Festival year.

Creating Safer Festivals for Everyone

The Federation and its member Festivals use the following policies and procedures to create **Safer Festivals** for everyone:

- 1. A single, definitive Child Protection Policy and a Vulnerable Adults at Risk Protection Policy adopted by all Federation Festivals.
- 2. One or more designated Festival Safeguarding Officers (FSO) appointed for each Federation Festival.
- 3. Name: Lynsey Paterson Phone: 07723 436130
- 4. Best practice advice in the form of **Safe Working Practice** and **Festival Child Protection leaflets**, with support and training for all Festival staff and volunteers. Including clear reporting procedures for anyone with a concern about a child or a vulnerable adult.
- 5. Appropriate recruitment and induction procedures for all new Festival staff and volunteers responsible for providing safe environments for everyone attending / performing at a Federation Festival.
- 6. All Festival personnel wear a coloured lanyard with a photographic identity badge. All teachers/parents/guardians/carers are asked to report all incidents of any nature to anyone wearing a Yellow or Blue lanyard with their identity badge. All reported incidents will be handled in accordance with the Safe Working Practice and Festival Child Protection best practice advice. In addition we will ensure the availability of a quiet area / room where concerns can be expressed in private.
- 7. For the duration of the Festival, all teachers/parents/guardians/carers are responsible for the continuous care and supervision of their own children/pupils/vulnerable adults. If they are unable to attend personally, they must delegate their responsibilities to an identified adult and ensure that their children/pupils/vulnerable adults are aware of the identity and name of the person responsible for their care. This includes supervision throughout all Festival venues, performance, practice and changing areas that may be provided.
- 8. No unauthorised photography, audio or video recording is allowed at our Festivals. Where parents/guardians/carers do not wish photos to be taken at all, then the responsible adult attending should ensure that their child/pupil/vulnerable adult is not included in official authorised photos.
- 9. Some children and vulnerable adults may have specific needs in order to take part. If this is the case we ask the responsible teachers/parents/guardians/carers to contact the Festival Secretary prior to arrival. The Festival actively seeks wherever possible to meet these needs, but must know beforehand in order to prepare support or to advise that help cannot be provided on this occasion.
- 10. The Festival's Child Protection Policy, Vulnerable Adults at Risk Protection Policy and approach to Creating Safer Festivals for Everyone is published explicitly in our Syllabus and Programme. By completing and signing the entry form all parents / guardians / carers and teachers of entrants under 18 (or vulnerable adults of any age) confirm that they give (or have obtained) the necessary consents for the entrants to take part in the Festival. Without consent, the entry to the Festival cannot be accepted.


